# *A Father's Thoughts for His Son*

Jesus said to [the boy's father],  
“If you are able!—All things can be done for  
the one who believes.” Immediately the  
father of the child cried out, “I believe; help  
my unbelief!”

**D**uring these days, I deeply empathize with the father and his “unbelief.” He asks Jesus to help his unbelief—to give him courage to believe. I too know how it feels to need courage when fear and adversity challenge your faith, especially when your child or loved one is near danger. My son is a lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps; at this moment he is embroiled in a fierce battle in the Middle East. My thoughts race back to the little boy I helped nurture through his toddler years and to the strong, young man he is today. I am frightened and concerned for his safety; I am concerned for those who serve with him and for the people they struggle to free. *Where is*

*God in all this? I keep asking myself. Am I losing my grip on faith? Jesus, I need courage—now. Help my unbelief!*

Fear can consume our very life's breath if we do not find the courage to face and overcome it. Only God knows where these difficult times of trial for humankind will lead. And only God can provide the comfort and peace that we so desperately seek. We can find courage through Scripture, prayer, and devotional time with God. Our "help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth" (Psalm 121:2).

When I close a letter to my son, I often write "*Semper Fidelis!*" — a Latin term that means "Always Faithful." When we live faithfully, we can anticipate strength and courage to meet the challenge of difficult times to come. I hope you will discover with me a source of courage in the thoughts, prayers, and verses that follow.
